We believe that creative collaboration between schools can deliver sustainable impact for learners and schools. Our alliance draws upon a wide range of knowledge and experience in the implementation of highly effective School to School improvement strategies. The agreed approach is to match each school's needs and strengths with the extensive expertise within our alliance this support is formulated by a Service Level Agreement to ensure there is a support structure established for each school. We will work with each organisation in structuring the support to ensure sustainable improvement and ensuring learning outcomes, leaving a legacy of learning that has made a recognisable difference for children.

Salop Teaching School Alliance success with supporting grants

- **Research & Development Closing the Gap Test and Learn Grant** - enabling schools to participate in large scale trials of intervention that may help close the attainment gap for disadvantaged pupils
- **Assessment for the new National Curriculum Initiative** - to undertake school-based enquiry on effective assessment systems to meet the needs of the new curriculum.
- **Stonewall Training the Trainer Diversity Programme** - an opportunity to train the trainer primary and secondary to deliver Stonewall courses tackling homophobic bullying and celebrating diversity
- **Subject Knowledge Enhancement SKE Grant** - building capacity through post initial teacher training (ITT) SKE a school led model - purpose of the project is to increase teacher capacity in Maths by providing a range of SKE training.
- **Primary National Curriculum Support Initiative** - supporting primary schools to lead curriculum change.
- **Salop & Herefordshire Maths Hub** - working to improve maths learning by developing teachers, CPD and producing resources.
- **School to School Support**- support for a primary and secondary school
- **Early School Intervention Grant** - to undertake a school based enquiry to investigate and share good practice relating to the use of data.

School Experience Programme

The Priory School as the lead school for the alliance is an approved School Experience Programme (SEP) school. This means we are able to offer people interested in becoming a secondary school teacher the opportunity to spend some time in school. This could be observing to see whether they feel a teaching career is for them or to gain experience in preparation for applying to become a teacher in our School Direct Programme.

Shropshire School Direct Partnership - Get into Teaching

School Direct is an approach to initial teacher training (ITT) that gives schools more influence over the ways teachers are trained.

We are pleased to announce a partnership has been formed with The North Shropshire and Darwin Teaching School Alliance which will be called the Shropshire School Direct. This means we are able to offer School Direct places covering early years, primary and secondary places.
